BACKGROUND

In its final report, the Truth and Reconciliation Commission of Canada called for the establishment of a highly-visible, publicly accessible structure in each capital city to honour survivors and all the children who were lost to their families and communities.

OBJECTIVE

Toronto Council Fire Native Cultural Centre is hosting the second annual **Indian Residential School Survivors (IRSS) Legacy Celebration**. The Celebration is a free, public event featuring cultural activations, traditional workshops, an indigenous marketplace and food vendors. To establish, through the engagement and interactions with residential school survivors and inter-generational members, the IRSS Legacy “Restoration of Identity” sculpture to be predominately displayed in the City of Toronto to commemorate the victims and survivors of residential schools. Creating a complimentary interactive Teaching, Learning, Sharing and Healing space for traditional ceremonies, gatherings, education, contemplation and the building of good relations.


